& 24th/ See the Vicar for further details.

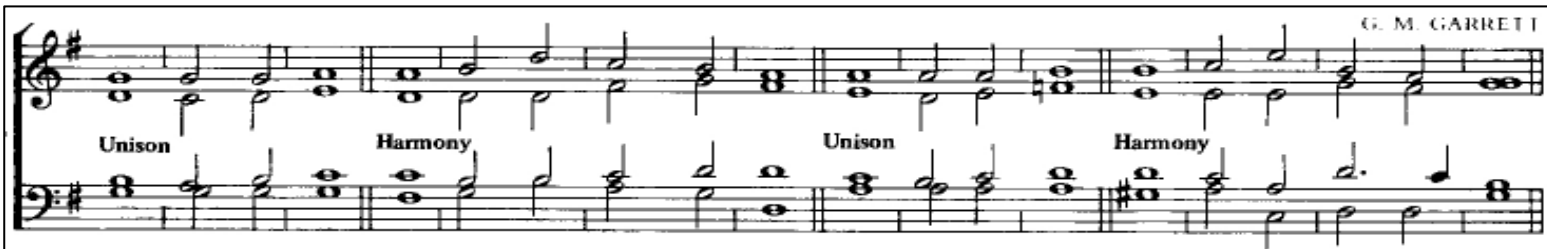
Confirmation:
